New Lights Now Aid Kitchen Work



In this re-lighted kitchen, a new "adaptor" unit provides generous cheerful illumination, while above the kitchen sink, a tubular luminaire bulb supplies extra light where it is most needed.

LIKE A GLOOMY DAY, a shadowy kitchen can depress one's spirits and make work go slower.

Young brides and experienced homemakers alike, however, are sometimes puzzled by the question of what to do about a poorly lighted kitchen. I have several "bright ideas" to suggest, with the accompanying photograph as a guide.

Before this kitchen was inexpensively re-lighted, a bare bulb was used at the ceiling. It was a glaring spot of light up above, and yet the young woman had to work in her own shadow when she stood at the cupboard with her back to the light.

In place of the bare bulb, a new inexpensive ceiling "adaptor" fixture was substituted. Many manufacturers make these fixtures. They can be installed in any single ceiling

outlet, with a simple twist of the wrist.

No rays of light come through the silvered end. Instead, nearly all of the light is sent up to the ceiling, and reflected into the room.

Shadowless light reaches every corner of the room. The common kitchen complaint of working in one's own shadow is thus eliminated.

Another new idea that helps to make this kitchen cheerful is the side lights. Above the kitchen sink is a luminaire bulb in a bracket. This was attached beneath the shelf, and connected to a nearby outlet.

For the range, breakfast table or sink, I'd like to suggest as another alternative one of those clever little lamps which may be pinned to the wall. With one of them you can tell exactly how much salt you are adding to cooking food.

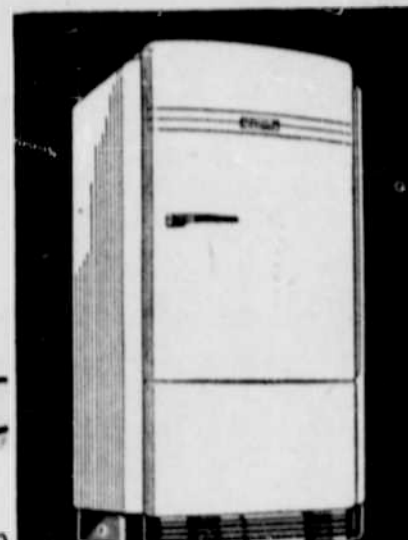
