

Coffee Goes Scotch in the Spice Cake!



COFFEE in the cake and coffee in the frosting makes the Latin-American background for this new cake authentic enough, but the roll of the rhumba gives way to the highland fling and a blow at the bag-pipes once the frosting gets "scotched". The recipe for this Latin cake with the "Tam-O-Shanter topping" follows:

Coffee Spice Cake
 1/2 cup shortening 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 1/2 cups brown sugar, firmly packed 1/2 teaspoon ginger
 1/2 cup molasses 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
 2 eggs, well beaten 1/2 teaspoon cloves
 1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
 1/2 cup double strength, freshly-made coffee, cooled 1/2 cup double strength, freshly-made coffee, cooled
 1/2 teaspoon soda 1/2 cup pecan halves
 Cream shortening, add sugar gradually and cream together until light and fluffy. Add molasses and well-beaten eggs. Sift flour with baking powder, soda, salt and

spices; add alternately with coffee, a small amount at a time, beat after each addition until smooth. Bake in a oiled pan (12" x 8") in a moderate oven (350°F.) 40 minutes. Frost with Coffee Scotch Frosting and place pecan halves on top of frosting.

Coffee-Scotch Frosting
 1 cup sugar 1/2 cup double strength, freshly-made coffee
 1/2 cup brown sugar, firmly packed 1/2 cup double strength, freshly-made coffee
 1 tablespoon light corn syrup 2 egg whites

Combine sugars, coffee and corn syrup in a sauce pan. Place over heat and stir until sugar is dissolved and mixture boils; continue cooking without stirring until a small amount dropped from the tip of a spoon spins a thread (249°F.). Beat egg whites stiff, pour the syrup slowly into the egg whites, beating constantly. Continue beating until the frosting holds its shape.
