Loaning Money To Governments

The legislation that was passed for the purpose of loaning money to Finland may bring a lot of trouble in future years—not on account of Finland but because of other features that spread loans in many directions. The U. S. Export-Import bank is handed 100 million dollars of which 20 million was ear-marked for Finland.

China, Norway, Sweden, Costa Rica, Columbia, Panama, Brazil, Paraguay, Nicaragua, Uruguay, and other Latin American countries including even underserving Bolivia and Mexico are said to have their hands outstretched for loans from the Export-Import bank. That means loans from the United States government to other governments.

Apparently, the sad misfortunes of the World War in loaning money to governments hasn't taught Uncle Sam his lesson—thus proving that you can't always believe that a burnt child dreads the fire.

What Is Clean Politics?

The Hatch Act forbids Federal employees from engaging in political affairs, and the latest chapter of this story concerns extending its provisions to cover state employees paid in part from Federal funds.

With these principles no one need disagree. But in view of the long history connected with legislation, abundant with orders of Department of the Government, and speeches by political leaders, there has been one result—and that is that such laws have been a complete failure.

It is perfectly clear that hundreds of thousands of public employees who receive all or part of their money from federal funds will obey natural impulses and quietly campaign for their favorite political candidates—the law notwithstanding, and not even restraining them.

Portland Gas & Coke Pays Large Tax

Portland Gas & Coke company's payment of \$10,715.91 for

1933 property taxes in Washington county, made this week was among the substantial single payments received to date at the tax collector's office. Thomas

H. Bailey, district manager for the gas company in this area, reports that the payment was for taxes on mains and other facilities for supplying gas service to customers in this area.

The gas company's payments in eight counties in Oregon and one county in Washington for 1933 property taxes totalled \$395,575.35. Washington county received one of the largest payments made by the company outside of Multnomah county.

Those required to register in order to vote in the May primary have until April 16 in which to register. Pathfinder Polls of Public Opinion

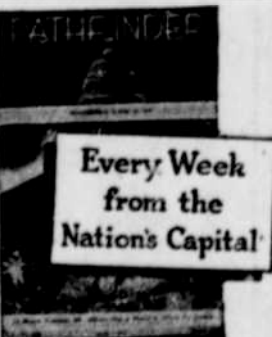
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
