

**FREE STORE-DOOR DELIVERY PLANNED**

Inauguration of free store-door pick-up and delivery service on less than carload freight shipments being shipped to or arriving from trans-continental points will become effective on July 25, it was announced recently by the freight traffic departments serving the Pacific Northwest.

**CAN'T HUNT ON THEIR OWN LAND**

Owners of land within game refuges or preserves have no right to hunt upon their own land and are subject to the same hunting restrictions as any other citizen. Such is the opinion of Attorney General I. H. Van Vinkle, to the Oregon Game com.

The question arose, when an owner of land within the Steens Mountain Game reserve contended that the commission had wrongfully threatened his arrest by state police if he was found with deer in his possession during hunting season on his own land, notwithstanding a license tag on the carcass. He contended that he was entitled to free use of the land together with the right to invite friends to hunt on his property.

The Attorney General held in his opinion that this man, and other land owners located within a game reserve, have no more rights than the public generally during the time the refuge is maintained. The only rights these land owners have, the opinion points out, is to prohibit others from going upon the land for the purpose of hunting.

Compared with other foods in the workingman's market basket



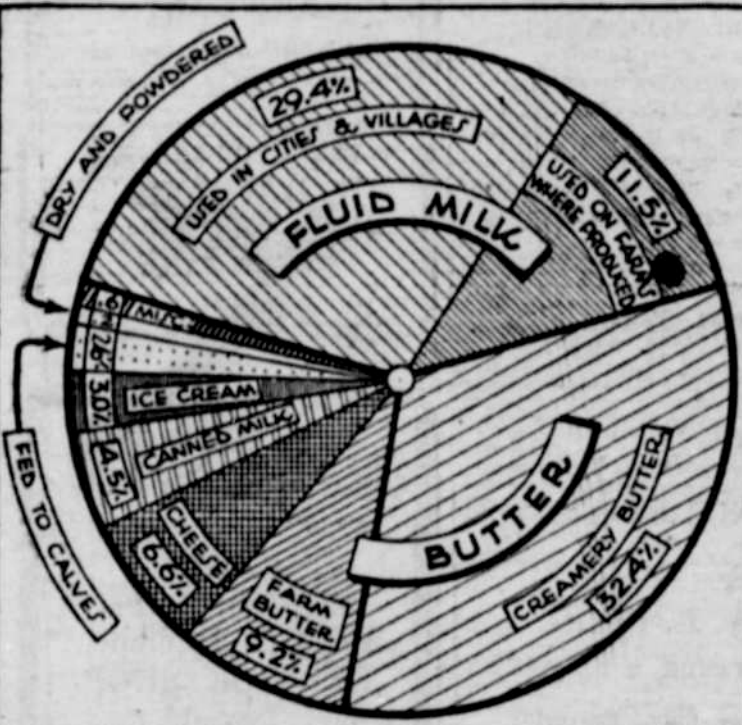

**MILK IS AN ENERGY FOOD**



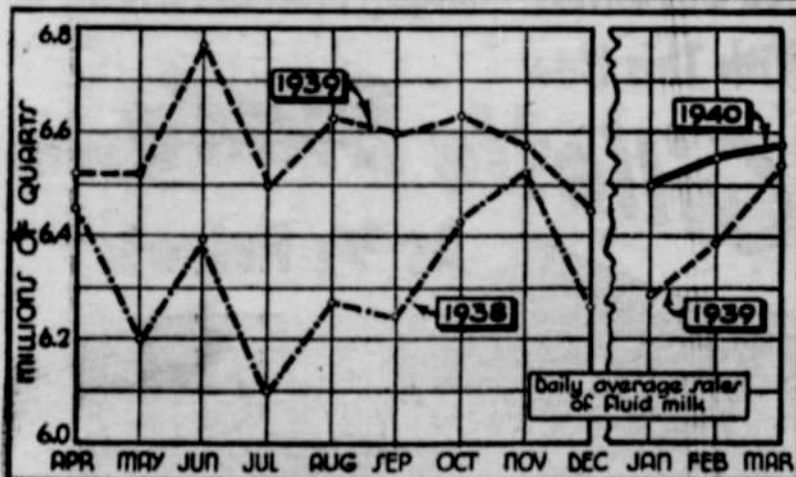

**How U. S. Milk Supply Is Used**

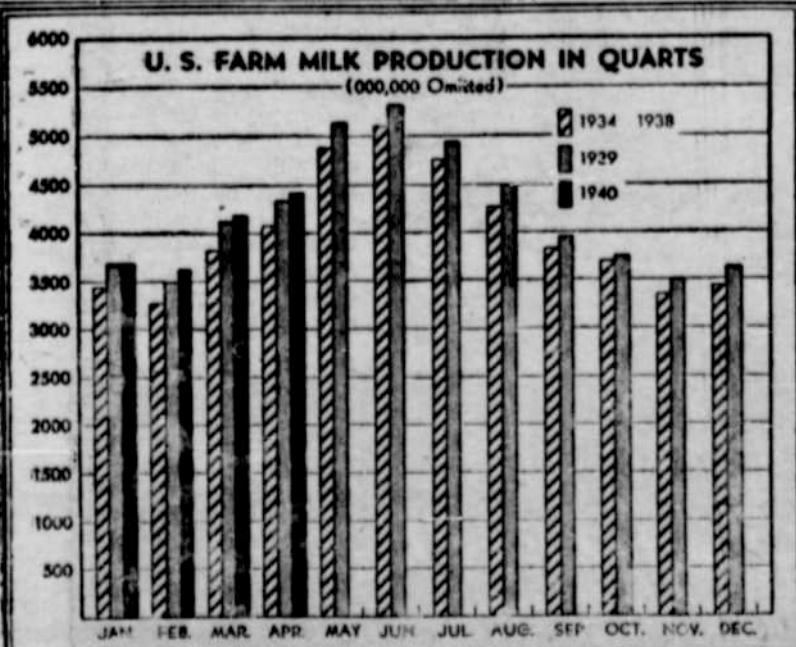


The U. S. milk supply annually totals 51 billion quarts says the Milk Industry Foundation and is utilized as shown on the chart.

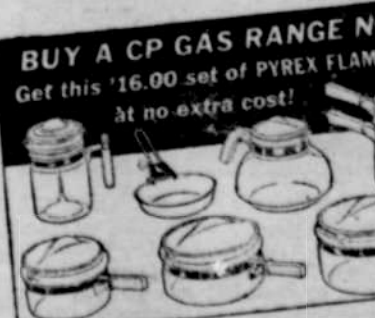
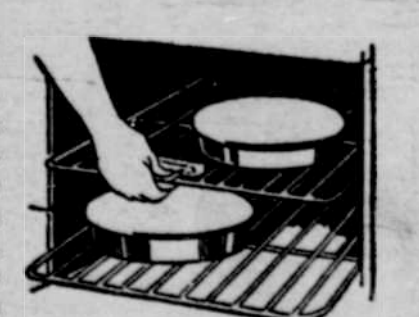
