

ANVAS murals can be applied to any hard, smooth surface with the use of a firm adhesive readily prepared at home by mixing five parts (by volume) quick drying, high quality varnish with six parts

Spread the mixture in a thin, even coating before laying canvas in place. Roll firmly to assure uni-

Take care to protect the outer surface of murals with a painter's cloth. or a piece of light canvas during the

New, unpainted plaster should be allowed at least six months to dry out, or receives a priming paint coat composed of 3 parts (by volume) oft paste white lead and 4 parts ead mixing or lead reducing oil before applying adhesive. Unseasoned contains free alkali which ends to keep adhesive from forming 1rm bond.

QUES. How can lead flashing be astened to prevent buckling?

ANS. To avoid buckling due to expansion and contraction cleatsiot nails-should be used to fasten

he sheet lead. Cleats should be of 3 pound hard

Turn one end of each cleat back over the holding nails to prevent the hail heads from causing demage to the lead. Fold the other end into loose-locks between the lead sheets, or-in case of an overlap or lacking joints at a given point—into a hem at the edge of flashing sheet.

Continuous cleats should not exceed eight feet in 'agth to prevent their buckling upon _xpansion which in turn causes the flashing to buckle and tear.
