

Oregon went through the 1st quarter of 1941 without one bicycle traffic fatality, Earl Snell secretary of state, disclosed this week. Last year ,there were 2 bicycle fatalities for the corresponding period.

Bicycle fatalities in the year 1949 were reduced 46 per cent from 1939, the first year deaths from accidents of this type hal shown a decrease in Oregon since 1931.

Much of the credit for the reduction in bicycle fatalities is given the various bicycle regulatory ordinances which have enacted by many Oregon communities during the past two More than 20 cities and towns in this state have adopted ordinances and several other localities are considering similar legislation at present.

The state traffic safety division has cooperated with Oregon communities in showing motion pictures on bicycle safety in schools and other groups and by sending speakers to assist in explaining bicycle safety and enconraging whole-hearted cooperation in observing bicycle regulations.

Hensley, district recruiting offi-Vacancies are again available in all of the Pacific forservice departments: the Hawaiian and Philippine Islands and the Panama Canal.

The colonel added that for those who have had a high school education or have had specialized training in a mechanicai trade, the regular army is offering enlistments in the air corps. Those who enlist in the air corns and who shiow special qualifications may be sent to one of sevtechnical schools where the enlisted man may study airplane mechanics and a variety of other subjects concerning aeriai defense.


