AMERICANISM

When in the course of human events it becomes necessary to suspend publication of a periodical that for almost a fifth of a century has carried out to the great public the news of a community, a reasonable consideration for the rights of others demands that the reasons therefore should be set forth as fully as time and other things over which we have no control will allow.
