The drillings were kept by L. F. Falkenstein, and when compared proved identical. The drillings taken from the Bandon well were found in the most favorable indications of cil. In fact, oil in small quantities has been removed from the well, and the drillers, who have had thirty years' experience, say that bil may be struck any moment.

Mr. Kaiser says the several thick nesses of shale and lime stone passed through are the same formations that may be found in the famous Coffeeville district of Kansas, where he was quite familiar with the oil conditions.

The company at Bandon is now sinking a ten-inch casing, and will reduce this as they go on down. They have equipment sufficient to sink a well to a depth of 4,000 feet. The work is being continued and a great deal of interest is being taken in same. Coos Bay Harbor.
