Stimulating an Old Tree.
An old tree that is injured needs very much to be stimulated. You can do this by cutting back well and fertilizing and cultivating it. You should give it a dressing of wood ashes and ground bone or acid phosphate, with some ferrihydric manure added. If possible loosen the soil around it early in the spring and if the weather is dry water it occasionally.

Matching Berry and Flower Beds.
In mulching strawberry beds, flower beds or trees and shrubs be careful to select a material for the mulch that will not "pack."
