Notice of Street Improvement

Notice is hereby given that on May 17, 1911, the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, at a regular meeting thereof, by resolution duly passed, ordered that his street in the Woolen Mill Addition to the City of Bandon be improved from the east line of Columbia avenue, then running East to the City limits on Broadway avenue, said improvement to consist of the building of a board sidewalk on south side of said street herein described in accordance with specifications for board sidewalks as contained in City Ordinance providing for the building of board sidewalks. Now, unless a written remonstrance be made and signed by the owners of TWO-THIRDS of the real property owners fronting upon the south side of his street as proposed to be improved and the same be filed with the City Recorder on or before July 9, 1911, then the Common Council will declare such improvement by Ordinance and the cost of said improvement to be assessed to the adjacent property fronting upon said portion of his street herein described. Notice of Street Improvement

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, did, on the 17th day of May, 1911, by resolution duly passed, determine to improve the South side of First street in the City of Bandon, Oregon, by building a sidewalk thereon to conform with the established grade of said street as is duly established by Ordinance No. 30, and, pursuant to Ordinance No. 142, said sidewalk is to be built of concrete and in accordance with specifications for concrete sidewalk as contained in said Ordinance No. 142 in connection with said sidewalk improvement and also made a part of this improvement will be the building of retaining wall where necessary and the excavating of ground to conform with the grade of street. All such specifications are now on file in this office and are open to the inspection of all persons interested therein. Said concrete sidewalk, so proposed to be built, is to extend from the South East corner of First and Wharf streets in the City of Bandon, then running West to the East line of the U. S. Life Saving Service property all on the South side of First street.

Now, unless a written remonstrance signed by the owners of TWO-THIRDS of the real property adjacent to and abutting on said portion of street as proposed to be improved and herein described shall be filed with the City Recorder within TWENTY (20) days from date of the first publication of this notice, the Common Council will pass an Ordinance directing that such improvement be made, and that the cost thereof be assessed to the adjacent property abutting on said portion of street as proposed to be improved.
