A portion of the light house jetty, 220 feet long, was washed down by the breakers Sunday night, and this, with what has previously gone out. makes a gap of nearly 400 feet that has been washed out.

The light house jetty was built only two years ago at a cost of about \$4,000 to the light house department and it would appear that it is impossible to build a jetty that will stand against the continual pounding of the surf in that particular place. It will be remembered by people who were here two years ago, how close the water came to undermining the the dwelling of the light house keepers, and only for the erection of the jetty at that time, the building would have been in the sea in a few days.
