To C. Evan Lucas, Otho L. Hopson, partners doing business under the firm name of Lucas & Hopson, and John R. Rohles, successor to C. Evan Lucas, in the partnership of said business, and Lorena Barrows, defendants and to each of you.

In the Name of the State of Oregon: You are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit on or before the last day of the time prescribed in the order for the publication of this summons; which prescribed time is six (6) weeks, the last day of which time will be Friday, the 22d day of March, 1912, and if you fail to so appear and answer said complaint, by the said time, the plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in plaintiff's complaint, a succinct statement of which is as follows, to-wit:

For a decree of the Court declaring that the defendants Lucas & Hopson are in default and in breach of the covenants of said agreement on their part, to sell a sufficient amount of said premises, first described in plaintiff's complaint, to-wit: As commencing at a point 30 ft. W. and 15 ft. N. of the S. E. corner of the N. 1-2 of the S. E. 1-4 of Sec. 25 Twp. 28 S.
