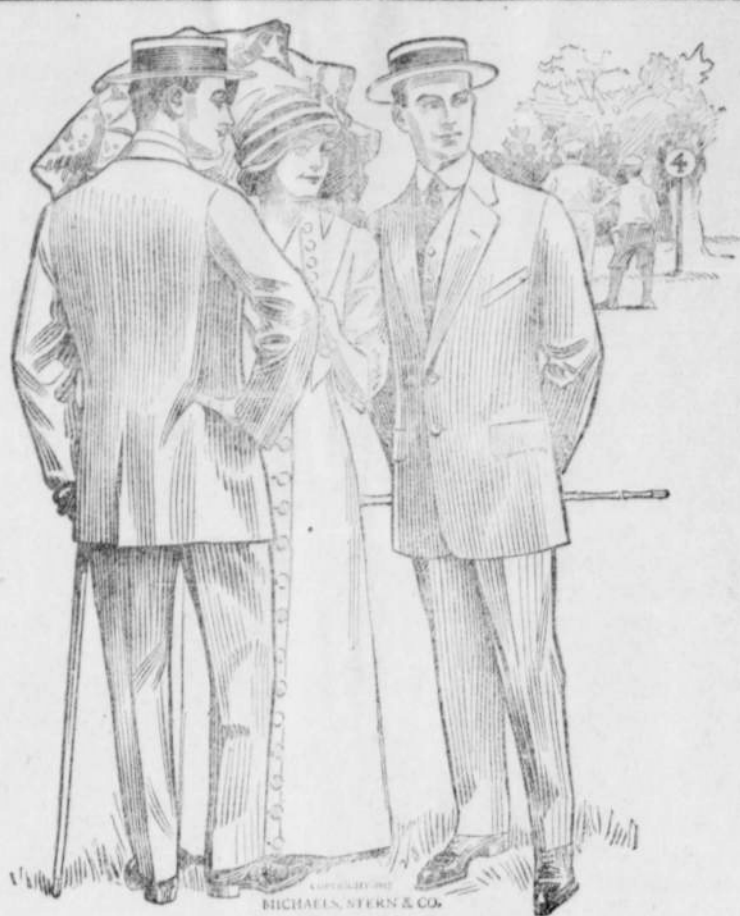

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, at the office of the City Recorder of said City, until 6 o'clock p.m. of the 17th day of April 1912, for street improvement bonds of said city.

Said bonds aggregate in amount \$1,947.01. They are issued in denominations of not less than \$25.00 or more than \$500.00. They bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum from the date thereof, payable semi-annually.

Said bonds mature in ten years from date they bear. Any bond may be fully paid and cancelled after one year from the date thereof, at the time of any semi annual coupon period upon notice.

The Common Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Every bid must designate the denomination of bond desired and must be accompanied by a certified check equal to five per cent. of the amount of bid, which shall be forfeited in case the bidder refuses to accept the bonds applied for.
