Sea Water For Street Cleaning.

In Blackpool, a city of Lancashire, the authorities have given a great deal of attention to the prevention of street dust. The principal streets are paved either with wood or asphalt and are swept from twelve to twenty times a day. The watering is done very thoroughly, and for this purpose sea water is used almost exclusively, since it has been found by actual test that sea water prevents dust about three times as effectively as fresh water and that it has no injurious effect upon the road surface when properly applied. The streets are not merely sprinkled, but are thoroughly scrubbed, brushes being used on all the paved streets.—London Mail.
