Mrs. Mitchell Replies to U'Ren on Single Tax.

When conscience is the spur, workers are to be found everywhere and among all classes.

Perhaps that is the reason that Mrs. Mitchell, who lives at Cove, Oregon, is such an ardent worker against what she feels are the pernicious attempts of the Single Taxers to capture the homes of the people of Oregon.

"False trash" is the manner in which Mrs. Matt Mitchell describes the U'Ren propaganda and U'Ren and his ilk, "the campaigners."

Like a modern but aged Joan of Arc, this old lady is organizing the farmers and the people of Union county against Single Tax. At her own expense she received books on the subject of the fight Single Tax and she distributed 200 of these herself over the great county in which she lives.

"It is people who own no real estate," said Mrs. Mitchell, the other day, "who are in favor of Single Tax, also the ignorant class, and those who take no newspaper at all." It is a shame that such men are allowed to vote at all on anything pertaining to taxation while thousands of intelligent people, who are heavy tax payers, must have their homes taxed away from them by such ignorant persons.

"Union County is one of the counties selected by that wolf in sheep's clothing, U'Ren, so we will all have to have to help in the fight. I am an old woman, but not too old to work in a good cause."

Mrs. Mitchell says that the whole of her section is up in arms. Every property owner in Eastern Oregon, from the man or woman who owns a small lot to the wheat farmers, is fighting what is known to be a confiscation of their homes, declares this old woman fighter for the common good.

Mrs. Mitchell, despite her years, worked arduously in the campaign against Single Tax. She circulated petitions, distributed 200 books, circulated cards and gave her time freely. In addition, she expended her money in the fight.

And when a person is willing to spend real money in a fight for a vital principle it must be conceded there is real enthusiasm for what she knows to be right.

The ballot numbers which will bar Single Tax from Oregon are: 304, 306 and 308.

The Pacific Northwest Land Products Show will be held in Portland, Oregon, under the auspices of the Oregon State Horticultural Society, November 18th to 23d inclusive, and full explanatory literature and premium lists will be sent in the near future.

The Pacific Northwest Land Products Show is the expanding of the scope and purposes of the Oregon Apple Show, after careful consideration by the Board of Directors and the officers of the Oregon State Horticultural Society, and a conclusion reached that the interests of those engaged in the many branches of agriculture should be recognized, as well as the interests of the orchardists. Therefore every district in the Pacific Northwest will be invited to arrange for competitive exhibition, collective displays of all orchard and soil products grown in and best adapted to their respective localities.

To the orchardist, districts, commercial clubs, and other exhibitors, will be offered attractive cash prizes and other premiums of value, as an inducement to exhibit the best of

their commercial fruits and products in all competitive classes.

No entry fee will be charged. Space will be allotted as near requirements as possible.

The Pacific Northwest Land Products Show will be educational in character and all its purposes, and by collecting in one grand display all that the orchard and soil produces will enable districts and individuals to compare their fruit and other crops with all other sections; to consider the effect of soils and climatic conditions, and thus learn what varieties are best suited to their own locality.

Spraying, pruning, and other educational demonstrations and lectures will be given daily.

Another interest that will be benefited in an educational way is the man looking forward to the time when he can get back to the land. In the past the information given him has been confined in only to the apple and other tree fruits, and it is now proposed to give him the tangible, indisputable evidence he wants—what each and every district in the Pacific Northwest will produce. This will interest the land seekers and tend to bring settlers to all localities.

As the Pacific International Dairy Show Association will hold their exhibition on the same dates in this city, it will be an additional attraction, not only to our exhibitors, but to all visitors interested in these particular lines.

The annual meeting of the Oregon State Horticultural Society will be held in Portland during the same week.
