From China Will Spring a New World Power

By Archbishop GIOVANNI BONZANO, Papal Delegate to the United States, Who Spent Seven Years in China

CHINA WILL SOON BE A FIRST CLASS WORLD POWER AND WILL EXERCISE VAST INFLUENCE FOR GOOD THROUGHOUT THE ORIENT.

There is a great and MAGNIFICENT FUTURE ahead of China. In fact, I prophesy that in a very few years, fewer than those think who have not had the opportunity of studying the people at close range, China will be one of the first class world powers.

I base this belief upon my knowledge of the personal character of the people, the THOROUGHNESS which has been evidenced in the secret political training which the secret societies have been carrying on. By secret societies I do not mean Freemasons or that kind of secret societies, but secret political societies. But more than all I am basing my belief in the future of this people upon the STURDY AND STERLING LOVE OF COUNTRY, OF FAMILY AND OF GOOD WHICH IS PLAINLY EVIDENCED IN ALL QUARTERS.

Knowing the people as well as I do, I must say that the change came about in a manner which was an ASTOUNDING SURPRISE. Of course we all knew of the prevailing unrest and the feeling of resentment that a dynasty so young that it had only a few hundred years to its credit should adopt the attitude which it did adopt, but even we did not suspect the—what you might call underground—work of propaganda and political instruction which has resulted in so marvelous an overturn.

It shows a CARE AND INTELLIGENCE FAR ABOVE THE ORDINARY in the planning of the campaign, and it augurs extremely well that the work of construction will proceed with the same RAPIDITY AND SURENESS that characterized the work of demolition.

OVERWORK WAS ONCE CONSIDERED A VIRTUE; NOW IT IS KNOWN TO BE A VICE. IT IS RECOGNIZED AS A DEBAUCH—ONE TO BE SHUNNED EQUALLY WITH THOSE OF ALCOHOL, OF OPIUM, OF MEAT AND OF EXCESSIVE PLEASURE. IT IS JUST AS FEROCIOUS. IT BRINGS IN ITS TRAIN JUST AS MANY ILLS. OVERWORK IS CONTAGIOUS. THE VERY AIR OF AMERICA BREATHES AND BURNS OVERWORK.

The wife of an overworked man is very apt to be driven from sheer lack of occupation and companionship into undertaking more and greater problems than are compatible with her strength. The HIGH COST OF LIVING, the desire to emulate one's neighbors and the WISH FOR LUXURIES beyond their grasp are important factors in bringing about overwork in both the sexes.

Overwork pleases because it stimulates; it entices because it LEADS TO POWER; it entrances because it beckons fame. Regard it, however, from the opposite point of view. IT ENSLAVES THE WORKER; it narrows his field of vision, augments his egotism and deprives his family and friends of the pleasures of his society and of the benefit of his experience. It is a SELFISH FASHION and one which inevitably leads to destruction. It makes a man unfit to live with, and it makes him unmindful of his duties as a man, a citizen and a patriot.

United States' Next President Will Face Serious Issues

THE man whom we elect president, whoever he may be, will need A COOL HEAD AS WELL AS A STRONG HAND.

HE WILL HAVE TO FACE ISSUES MORE PRETENTIOUS THAN ANY WHICH HAVE CONFRONTED THIS COUNTRY AT ANY PERIOD OF ITS HISTORY SAVE ONLY IN THE ADMINISTRATIONS OF WASHINGTON AND LINCOLN.

This government is not indestructible any more than the Titanic was unsinkable. ITS VERY SIZE AND STRENGTH MAY BE TURNED AGAINST IT and become the agents of its destruction. We must keep the searchlight sweeping the seas, and, above all, we must keep to the longer but safer course.

THE CARIBBEAN COUNTRIES.

In view of the repeated and emphatic announcements of the Monroe doctrine at all periods in our history and by all shades of domestic political opinion and the emphasis which seems to have been given to that doctrine by the extreme care the senate recently took to prevent the possibility of any phase of its assertion being submitted to arbitration, I am more than ever convinced of the logic and wisdom of our helping the weaker republics to help themselves to avoid specific conditions where we might be embarrassed by its assertion. The almost incalculable native wealth of the Caribbean countries, the great variety and beauty of scenery and the salubrity of climate are the physical conditions that most impressed me. With political and financial stability in such countries where these conditions are now wanting and under the benevolent sway of peace, there are bound to be a steady development of their resources and a growing appreciation of their natural charms and attractions.—Secretary Knox.
