Wheat Brings \$1000 Bushel.

Minneapolis Minn., Dec. 11—Joseph P. Nash and Charles Bridgman of Clyde Park, Montana, were awarded the \$5000 first prize today for the best five bushels of wheat exhibited at the Northwestern Products Exposition held here in November. The grain was the turkey red varieties and was grown in the Shield River Valley, 70 miles north of Yellowstone Park.

It went over 60 pounds to the bushel measure and in grading received a score of 91½

In the laboratory tests, however, which consisted of milling and baking, the grain received a score of 104.7.
