As the three members representing labor on the Workmen's Compensation Commission appointed by Governor Oswald West, we deem it our duty to inform you that the bill as drafted has aroused a great opposition from a certain class of attorneys, casualty insurance companies and some financial interests and unscrupulous employers. All of them are anxious to defeat this bill. They will bring much pressure to bear upon our legislature and will be there in person to voice their objection. And unless you Mr. Workingman, (the one who is most interested), take a hand, they will succeed in their selfish object and defeat the bill. Realizing that you cannot go to the capital and urge the passage of this bill in person we ask you to sign a petition and see to it that every workingman in your vicinity is given an opportunity to sign a petition to the 1913 legislature requesting the passage of the Workmen's Compensation Bill, as drafted by the Commission appointed by the governor; and mail it to the address given below. We will see to it that the petitions are presented to the legislature at the proper time; and again ask you to act in this all important matter at once.
