Our Secondary Schools Turn Out Efficient but Godless Men and Women

OUR SECONDARY SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES TOO OFTEN TURN OUT EFFICIENT, BUT GODLESS, CYNICAL, DEBAUCHED, UNSOCIALIZED YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN—A CURSE INSTEAD OF A BLESSING TO THE HOME AS WELL AS TO SOCIETY.

MORAL CONDITIONS IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES ARE PERHAPS WORSE THAN THEY WERE TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO. THEY ARE, TO SAY THE LEAST, THE CAUSES OF THE MOST SERIOUS ANXIETY.

The work of the schools is essentially THAT OF CHARACTER BUILDING. There are those who would give up what they call foolish talk of this sort and say that the business of the schools is EFFICIENCY. They give examinations in terms of INTELLECTUAL, not MORAL, attainments. Against that position I protest.

The question of the MORAL and RELIGIOUS influence at school is INEVITABLY a question of the TEMPERAMENT and DISPOSITION of the TEACHER and the atmosphere he or she creates.

In the school you have all the elements of a bad society. You have the STRONG OPPRESSING THE WEAK, RACE PREJUDICE, CLASS PREJUDICE AND SNOBBERY. We have all the opportunity of making a good society out of this. We must make the child understand how to live.

THAT THE SCHOOL SHOULD EVER WASH ITS HANDS OF THIS QUESTION AND SAY THAT ITS BUSINESS IS ONLY WITH BOOKS AND MAPS AND NOT WITH THE GREAT SPIRITUAL AND MORAL VALUES WOULD BE A PITY INDEED. YOU TEACHERS ARE MINISTERS, CALLED WITH A DIVINE CALLING.

Notice for Bids for Improvement of Columbia Avenue Between Iris St. and Second St.

Notice is hereby given: That the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, will receive sealed bids until 7:30 o'clock p. m. of the 5th day of February 1913, for the improvement of that portion of Columbia Avenue lying between the South line of Iris street and the north line of Second street in the Woolen Mill Addition to Bandon, Oregon, according to plans and specifications for said improvement as prepared by the City Engineer of the City of Bandon, and which are now on file in the office of the City Recorder of said city, and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein. The said improvement will consist of furnishing all materials, tools, machinery and labor necessary for the efficient and proper embankment of street, the reconstruction of sidewalks, and the construction of wooden curbs.

Bids will be received in accordance with the plans and specifications as referred to for the street complete as follows:

1. Price per cubic yard of earth embankment.
2. Price per lineal foot of rebuilding sidewalk.
3. Price per lineal foot of wooden curbing.

Blanks for bidder will be furnished by the City Recorder upon application and no bids will be considered that are not made out on said blanks. Bids must be accompanied with a certified check payable to the City of Bandon for a sum equal to 5 per cent of the total amount of bid as a guarantee that the bidder receiving the contract will within five days from the date that said contract is awarded by the Council execute a contract in writing to perform the work in accordance with specifications and plans as referred to, and upon failure to enter into such contract by the bidder said certified check shall be forfeited as liquidated damages. Bidder receiving the contract will be required to furnish a bond to the amount named in the specifications for said work.

All bids must be filed with the City Recorder of the City of Bandon, Oregon. Common Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or to let the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.
