train that carried them to Salem for the opening of the session and later they visited the state institution at Corvallis and Eugene. The Ir rigation Congress was notable as being the most important gathering of irrigationists ever held in this state, and the visit of the delegates to the capital was full of interest. Memorials to Congress on important subjects have been prepared by the Oregon Legislature. One asks for appropriations for the improvement of Tillamook, Yaquina and Coos bays. Another memorial asks for the protection of migratory game birds and anothe suggests a federal law to curb the divorce evil. The Russel Sage Foundation has probed the public school systems of all the states and finds Oregon ranks 15th in efficiency among the 48 commonwealths of the nation. This state, however, is found to stand first in point of attendance, the percentage being 87. -------
