### Notice for Bids for Street Improvement.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, will receive sealed bids until 7:30 o'clock p. m. of the 19th day of February 1913, for the improvement of Riverton Avenue in Azalea Park to Bandon, Oregon, from the West line of Spruce street westerly to the East line of Aberdeen street, according to the plans and specifications for said improvement as prepared by the City Engineer, and which are now on file in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Bandon, and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein.

Said improvement will consist of installing all material, tools, machinery and labor necessary for the efficient and proper grading of roadway, the building of wooden curbs and the building of wooden sidewalks.

Bids will be received in accordance with above mentioned specifications for the street complete as follows:

- 1 Price per cubic yard of earth excavation.
  - 2 Price per lineal foot of curb.
  - 3 Price per lineal foot of sidewalk.
- Blanks for bidder will be furnished by the City Recorder upon application and no bids will be considered that are not made out on blanks.

Bids must be accompanied with a certified check payable to the City of Bandon, for a sum equal to 5 per cent of the total amount of bid as a guarantee that bidder receiving the contract will within 5 days execute a contract in writing to perform the work according to specifications and upon failure of the contractor to enter into said agreement with the city of Bandon, said certified check shall be forfeited as liquidated damages.

Bidder receiving the contract will be required to furnish a bond in amount as specified in specifications for said work.

All bids must be filed with the City Recorder of the City of Bandon, Oregon. Common Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to let the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

### SOCIETY TO LESSEN STREET ACCIDENTS.

All Members Are Pledged to Obey Street Rules.

The purpose of the National Highways Protective Society is to promote safety on public highways. One of the most interesting phases of its work is found in its junior branch. The children that apply for membership in the branch pledge obedience to the following rules:

All members must agree to use the nearest playground.

No member shall play ball or any game where a missile is thrown in the streets.

All members shall refrain from hitchhiking on to vehicles, moving or stationary.

No member shall jump on or off moving street cars or other vehicles.

No member shall jump at, throw stones or stand in front of automobiles, wagons and trolley cars.

All members shall cross the streets only by crosswalks.

All members shall endeavor to aid, as far as lies in their power, the maintenance of clean streets.

No member shall throw paper or refuse of any description in the streets, or build bonfires, or spit ash or garbage cans.

### A COMING PROFESSION.

Summer Sets Lead With City Manager Announcement.

So far as our knowledge goes, the city of Bandon, O. C. is justified in claiming that it has introduced a new and coming profession. "The Sentimental American. Through the secretary of its chamber of commerce that enterprise community has announced that applications will be received for the office of city manager of Bandon. From the brief summary of the requirements for this office we gather that the applicant should be competent to oversee public work, such as paving, building, water supply etc; that an engineer would be preferred; that he must state what has been his previous experience in municipal work; that he will have complete administrative control of the city, subject to the approval of a board of three elected councilmembers; and that he will hold office so long as he gives satisfaction to the councilmembers; that his work will be purely that of an expert and that he will be entirely free from political control; finally, although these conditions and conditions will be taken into consideration, local citizenship will not be necessary.

### Form Town Planning Association.

Following a two day conference at Education attended by delegates from the principal cities and towns in the province of Alberta, a Provincial Town Planning and Housing Association was formed. The objects of the new association are to aid municipalities in their improvement and extension whereby a proper development of the town or city on hygienic and artistic lines may be secured and the securing of legislation looking to this end. It is the most concise quoted which expresses the program of the new organization. From first to last the convention emphasized the urgent need of legislation if the cities which have taken up town planning are to realize their ideals of a more convenient, more healthful and a more beautiful city.

### Street Tree Guards.

The most effective guards for young trees are made by driving in the ground four sturdy wooden stakes about two inches square and covering these with wire mesh. These guards should always be as high as the tree, and care should be taken to make necessary additions to the height as the tree grows. The municipality should have charge of all street tree protection and provide suitable guards for all.
