Dear Sir: Replying to yours of Feb. 26th in regard to the establishment of our Public Library will say that the Ladies Civic Improvement Club of this city about four years ago organized for the purpose of advancing the civic interest of our town. One of the things they did at that time was to raise money through public entertainments and by soliciting monthly subscriptions from the business men to support a public library and ladies rest room. They rented three office rooms in our business section, one of which was used for the ladies rest room and the other two for the library. The interest in the public library from the time it was started until now has continually increased.

About one year ago the ladies appointed a committee to confer with Mr. Carnegie and after some time we succeeded in securing an appropriation from him of ten thousand dollars for a library building. This building has just been completed and was dedicated on last Wednesday evening. We consider there is nothing in the city that is of more benefit both morally and intellectually to the boys and girls than this library.

The Ladies Civic Improvement club have kept the library supplied with books and have raised the most of the money from public entertainments such as; Society Circuses, Ice Cream Socials in the park tag days and several other minor ways have raised smaller amounts.

Every public spirited citizen of your city should give hearty support to your library movement as there is nothing that will give a city a higher moral tone and furnish its transient people and the young boys and girls something substantial more than a public library. Big Increase in Assessment

There will be a marked increase in Coos county assessments this year and the total valuation of the county from about \$19,000,000 to about \$24,000,000. Assessor T. J. Thrift has just completed arrangements for the work and left yesterday for Bandon where he will begin assessing. He has appointed a number of deputies for the work, as follows: Marshfield—Geo. N. Bolt. North Bend—Peter Loggie. Upper Coquille—A. P. Miller. Lower Coquille—Archie Collier. Catching Inlet and north part of County—Chas. St. Dennis.

Mr. Thrift will personally assess Bandon, Coquille and Myrtle Point. In addition to the marked increase in real estate valuations, as a result of the railroad boom, live-stock will also be assessed higher. Hogs will be assessed at \$5 per hundred, dairy cows at \$35, yearling cattle at \$12.50, two year olds at \$25. No definite schedule is fixed for horses, sheep or goats.

Logged-off lands will be assessed at \$3 per acre. Last year the valuation on them was \$2 per acre. Other real estate will be assessed according to the market value—Coos Bay Times.

H. J. McMiarnid returned today from Bandon. He reports that the council there is figuring on considerable street improvements this year. He says that people from southern Curry County report that the Brooklyn Lumber Company is building an immense concrete jetty out into the ocean to provide a means of loading lumber from their new mill on ships. Five miles of railroad will be built for it and in the neighborhood of a million dollars will be spent by the company.—Coos Bay Times.
