**Notice for Bids for Street Improvement.**

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Oregon, will receive sealed bids until 7:30 o'clock p. m. of the 19th day of March, 1913, for the improvement of Second Street in the Breakwater Addition from the West line of Spruce Street to the East line of Bluff Street according to plans and specifications for said improvement as prepared by the City Engineer and now on file with the City Recorder of Bandon, Oregon, and open to the inspection of all persons interested therein.

Said improvement will consist of furnishing all tools, machinery and labor necessary for the efficient and proper grading of roadway to a width of ten (10) feet, and rip-rapping the embankment where ordered by the Engineer.

Bids will be received in accordance with the specifications as referred to for the street complete as follows:

1. Price per cubic yard of earth excavation.
2. Price per square yard of rip-rapping embankment.

Blanks for bidders will be furnished by the City Recorder upon application and all bids must be made out on blanks.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check equal to 5 per cent of the total bid.

Common Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or to let the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.
