Free Freight for the Children's Industrial Exhibits at the Oregon State Fair.

I am sure the school children of Oregon will be delighted to know that the different rail roads; the S. P., the O. W. R. N. and the Hill lines in Oregon, including the Astoria line, the Oregon electric and the United Railways, have all agreed to carry the school children's exhibits to and from the State Fair, this year, free of charge.

In order to take advantage of this liberal offer the exhibits of a certain county, or district, must be assembled at one or more convenient shipping points and shipped to gether in the name of the County School Superintendent, teacher or other authorized person.

This is a fine thing for the railroads to do, and it will help wonderfully in this industrial contest. Now the child 200 miles away Salem can send an exhibit to the fair just as well as one only 20 miles away. We hope the boys and girls all over the state, knowing this fact early in the season, will begin at once to prepare something for the State Fair. It begins September 29 this year, and the prize list is larger and more attractive than last year. The list will be off the press in a few days and sent out to the County School Superintendents from whom each family can secure a copy.

Besides the fine line of regular and special prizes in the individual classes, there are five cash prizes ranging from \$100 down to \$40 for the best collective exhibit by the schools of any county. There are also five special prizes for the best exhibit by one room districts outside of counties making a county exhibit.

Oregon has a good chance to lead the world in industrial work this year, and reap a great reward. To this end we hope to have the cooperation of not only all the teachers and children, but of every other citizen of the state.—N. C. Maris, Field Worker Industrial Fairs.

Censorship of Books by Public Library Committee.

A pamphlet has been recently circulated on the streets of Bandon making strong implication that the Reverend Mr. Steele had appointed himself chief censor for the Bandon Public Library. The article which makes this implication and which is published by one Dr. B. K. Leach is misleading. Mr. Steele is only one member of the library board. As a part of this board there is a Book Committee whose duty it is to pass upon all books presented to the library. This Book Committee has neither received nor rejected any book. Some few books have been donated to the library, but they have not yet been placed in circulation, because the committee has not yet had opportunity to pass upon them. The cause for the complaint of Dr. Leach is that Mr. Steele found one morning on one of the library tables a book entitled "Prison Memoirs of an Anarchist."

This book had never been presented to the Library Committee and had neither been received nor rejected. However, Mr. Steele's judgment prompted him to remove the book from the table of the library and keep it until such time as the Book Committee could pass upon its merits and demerits.

The library board wish to assure all friends of the library that any good book will be gladly accepted by them, but that they will not hesitate to turn down any book containing doctrines or sentiments that are inimical to the highest interests of society, and be it understood that a Public Library is not the place for disseminating any special doctrine, although any sane literature of any political party, any ecclesiastical order or of anything else has a legitimate place in the Public Library. —SIGNED, S. Indorsing the Asp.
