Land Resources.

Secretary of the Interior Franklin K. Lane has stated his position utilization of public land resources which much interest is being manifested in the Pacific Northwest. The secretary recently received through Senator Poindexter a telegram from a State Senator stating that the legislature of Washington had manimously passed an act reserging all waters in the Wenatchee basin, but that before the act was signed by the governor certain power interests had filed on these waters, and urging the President and the Secretary of the Interior to serve the best interests of the State of Washington by maintaining intact Presidenc Talt's Executive of resevoir sites involved.
