Elk in Curry County.

The Myrtle Point Enterprise says: "E. J. Baker, district deputy game warden for Coos and Curry counties, arrived in this city last Saturday, having come up from his home in Curry by way of the Sixes through Ekly and down the South Fork on the 'hurricane deck' of a mule. Mr. Baker's jurisdiction has recently been extended to cover Coos county and he is making this trip to appoint deputies in various localities. He has been State Game Warden Finley's able assistant in Curry county for years.

"Mr. Baker stated that a census of the elk in Curry county shows that there are today about eighty of these animals in the forests of that county, and he has them surrounded by a line of faithful deputies. Before the end of the year Mr. Baker hopes to have a line on the number and haunts of elk herds in Coos County."

\$30 a Stump.

Dr. C. H. Shattuck, dean of the forestry department of the University of Idaho, says research has convinced him there is \$30 worth of by-products in the overage yellow or white pine stump of the West. He believes means will be evolved whereby enough money will be realized from the stumps to pay the cost of clearing. The products obtainable are valuable commercial commodities such as tar, turpentine, acids, charcoal and shingle stain. He estimates the saving of these by-products will double the profits of the lumber business in the West. —Pioneer Western Lumberman.
