Last year butter fat brought an average of 41.3c per pound and each cow in the county produced, on an average \$106.00. Good dairying is also reported from Buena Vista, where one herd of 21 cows brought a check for \$158.16, an average \$14.37 for each cow during the month, and Coos County is as good for dairying any day in the week as Tillamook County.
