JAIL FOR SUFFRAGETTE

London, April 3.—Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, leader of the militant suffragettes, was found guilty at the Old Bailey Sessions today and sentenced to three years' penal servitude on the charge of inciting persons to commit damage.

The jury added to the verdict of "guilty" a strong recommendation for mercy and when the judge pronounced a heavy sentence of three years the crowd of women in the court room rose in angry protest. Mrs. Pankhurst, in her closing address to the jury, spoke 50 minutes. In the address she frequently wandered so far from the matter before the court that the judge censured her. Mrs. Pankhurst denies any malicious incitement and announced she did not wish to call witnesses.
