Notice of Street Work.

Notice is hereby given: That the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Twelfth Street (Formerly Langlois Avenue) from the West end of said street in West Bandon running thence East through Azalea Park to the East end of said street in the Morras Addition to Bandon, Oregon, at the expense and cost of the owners of the Lots, parts of Lots and tracts of land included in the improvement district hereafter described and to be known as improvement District No. 6 of Twelfth Street (Formerly Langlois Avenue) which district embraces all of the property on either side of said street and abutting thereon between the West end of Twelfth Street in West Bandon and the East end of said street in the Morras Addition to Bandon, Oregon, from the marginal line of said street back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon. Said improvement is to consist of grading the roadway, constructing wooden curbs the construction of 6 foot wide wooden sidewalks and the construction of cross-walks. All of said improvements are to be built upon the established grade of Twelfth Street (Formerly Langlois Avenue) and in accordance with the plans and specifications thereof prepared by the City Engineer filed in the office of the City Recorder and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein.

The total cost of said improvement is estimated to be \$2,181.27. Any objections to said improvement must be filed in writing with the

City Recorder by the owners of two-thirds in the area of the property within the above described improvement district within 15 days from the date of the posting of notices on Twelfth Street (Formerly Langlois Avenue) by the City Engineer which notices are required to be posted within 5 days from the first publication of this notice.

This notice is published in accordance with a resolution of the Common Council passed at a meeting held on the 16th day of April 1913.
