Notice of Special Election.

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held at the usual polling place within said City of Bandon, Oregon, namely, in the Council Room, in the City Hall, of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, for the purpose of voting on the following questions to-wit:

1. Shall the City of Bandon purchase the present Water System for the sum of Sixty-Two Thousand Dollars, and issue and sell its negotiable six per cent interest bearing coupon bonds in payment for the same?

2. An Ordinance prohibiting live stock from running at large within the corporate limits of the City of Bandon.

3. An Ordinance authorizing the Common Council of the City of Bandon to issue and sell its negotiable six per cent interest bearing coupon bonds in the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars for the redemption of outstanding general warrants.

4. An Ordinance authorizing the Common Council of the City of Bandon to issue and sell its negotiable six per cent interest bearing coupon bonds in the sum of Six Thousand Dollars for the redemption of outstanding general warrants issued for the purchase of what is known as the "Base Ball Park."

5. An Ordinance authorizing the Common Council of the City of Bandon to levy a One Mill Tax upon all taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Bandon for the purpose of maintaining a Public Library.

6. An Act to amend sub-section 11 of section 102 of the Charter of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, adopted by the people at a special election held May 3, 1912, relating to the limit of special assessments on property.

7. An Act to amend section 91 of the Charter of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, adopted by the people at a special election held on the 3rd day of May 1912, relating to the collection of assessments.

8. An Act to amend section 40 of the Charter of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, adopted by the people at a special election held on the 3rd day of May 1912, relating to the election and term of office of Councilmen.

9. An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, to purchase, install and equip the City of Bandon with Fire Apparatus and for the purpose of paying therefor to issue and sell its negotiable six per cent interest bearing coupon bonds in the sum of Twelve Thousand Dollars.

10. An Ordinance authorizing and directing

the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, to purchase the following described property for a City Hall site, to-wit: Lots 1, 2, 3, 12, 13 and 14 in Block 9, Woodland Addition to Bandon, Oregon, and for the purpose of paying therefor, to issue and sell its negotiable six per cent interest bearing coupon bonds in the sum of Six Thousand Dollars.

All qualified voters residing within the corporate limits of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, are hereby invited to vote for or against each of said propositions.

Said Special election will be held on the 9th day of June, A. D. 1913, and the polling place will be in the City Council Room in the City Hall. And the polling place will be open for voting from 9 o'clock a. m. until 7 o'clock p. m. of said day. The following are the Judges of election, Chris Rasmussen, R. E. Buck and S. Mundy, and the following are the Clerks of said election, W. R. Mavity and George Manciet.

Notice of Assessments for the Improvement of Curry Street (now Chicago Avenue) between 6th Street (now 11th Street) and 8th Street (now 13th Street) Woodland Addition to the City of Bandon, Oregon.

Notice is hereby given: That at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, held upon the 2nd day of April 1913, Ordinance No. 261 Entitled "An Ordinance declaring the assessments upon Curry Street from its intersection with the south line of 6th Street southerly to its intersections with the north line of 8th Street, in the Woodland Addition to the City of Bandon, Oregon," was duly passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor on said date, which ordinance directs me to enter the said assessments in the Docket of City Liens and from the date of the entry thereof in said docket of City Liens the sum as entered against each lot or parcel of land, becomes and is a lien upon such lot or parcel of land, and unless the assessment is paid within the time prescribed by the Charter of the City of Bandon, Oregon, or bonded as required by Law the lot or parcel of land so assessed will be sold to pay the assessment interest and cost.
