places on the program. Among
these are Ng Poon Chew, a native
of China but now in this county;
Dr. S. Motoda of Tokyo, Japan;
Dr. Armenag Haigazian of Konia,
Asia Minor; Dr. Charles Merle
d'Aubigne, Paris, France; Prof.
Theophil Mann, Frankfurt-on-
Maine, Germany; F. De Rougemont
of Neuchatel, Switzerland; Dr.
J. R. Patterson of Belfast, Ire-
land; and John Lamond, B. D., of
Edinburgh, Scotland. America will
be represented on the program by
many of her leading citizens, among
them being Ex. United States Vice
President Charles W. Fairbanks,
Ex. United States Commissioner of
Immigration, Robert Watchorn,
and President Woodrow Wilson
(affairs of state permitting.)
