

S. P. TO SPEND \$30,000,000

Budget Calls for Survey of Coast Road from Coos Bay to Eureka, California.

San Francisco, June 11.—The Southern Pacific has filed with the state railroad commission a statement of the improvements it proposes to make over its system during the fiscal year, for which application was made yesterday to issue \$30,000,000 in five per cent two year notes. The items include the construction of the Willamette Pacific and a line from Salem to Durbin and surveys from Battle Mountain to Palisade, and from Marshfield to Eureka, California.

For the two surveys, an appropriation of \$42,450 is provided.

For improvements in the Coos Bay, Roseburg, and Eastern, \$1500.

Reimbursement of treasury for cash expended, representing a part only of capital investments heretofore made and not included in the following \$7,500,000.

Cash payments for equipment in addition to equipment trust note \$3,460,000.

Additions to Atlantic steamship lines, \$1,763,000.

Additions to facilities of Pacific system \$9,775,000.

Allowance for contingencies yet undetermined, \$1,997,000.

C. O. D. Parcel Post.

Postmasters have received copies of a general order providing for the installation of the collect on-delivery system for the parcel post. The new rule provides that after July 1, 1913, packages may be sent by parcel post C. O. D. provided that the full amount of the postage on the package is paid and ten cents in parcel post stamps in addition to the amount required, be attached to the package. Upon delivery of the package the person to whom it is addressed must pay the charges on the package and sign a receipt, which also serves as an application for a money order. This tag, together with the amount collected, is returned to the money order department where a money order is made out to the sender of the package and forwarded in a penalty envelope, the money order serving the sender of the package as receipt for the goods. No goods so sent may be examined until the charges on the packages have been paid. No package can be returned after delivery.

This new branch of the parcel past service will undoubtedly increase the business. Any package so sent is insured for its value, which shall not exceed \$100, without extra charge. C. O. D. packages may be received by and sent to money order offices only.—Coquille Sentinel.

RANDOLPH TO BE FLOATED

Gasoline Schooner Not Badly Damaged—Accident Was Unavoidable.

The gasoline schooner Randolph, which was driven on the beach at Rogue River about ten days ago, has been hauled up out of danger and is being repaired and in a couple of weeks will be hauled over the sand and launched in Rogue River. The vessel is not badly damaged and the cost of repairs and getting her back in deep water will probably be about \$2,000. The vessel was not insured, unless some of the stockholders had their individual interest insured, but the cargo was insured. The insurance rate on the small boats plying in and out of the small harbors on the coast is prohibitive being about ten per cent.

Tom Golden, a member of the crew arrived here yesterday from Rogue river and is arranging to put the gasoline schooner which has been tied up at North Bend for several months, on the run again. The Enterprise is owned by the Wedderburn Trading Company and has been completely overhauled. Captain Anderson, of the Randolph will be master of her and will reach here in a couple of days to take her out. The Enterprise is most too small for the run but was being figured on just prior to the loss of the Osprey, to be operated in conjunction with the Osprey.

Mr. Golden says that the report that the wreck of the Randolph was due to the fault of Engineer Wulff is absolutely without foundation. He says that when they attempted to enter, the Rogue river bar was pretty rough and a breaker struck them, ripping some of the rear planking off and opening the gasoline tank. The salt water getting into the gasoline made their engine useless and they were driven up on the beach. They did not lose their deckload, as was reported, and only part of the deckload was damaged.

All in all, the results were lucky for Mr. Golden. In the last trip, they got caught on Clatsop Spit on the Columbia and lost their rudder but got off safely and made the repairs and then followed the accident at Rogue River, following a wait of several days outside and at Port Orford for a chance to get in.

Besides escaping from the two wrecks with his life and without injury, Mr. Golden barely escaped a heavy financial loss in the Randolph. He had arranged for the purchase of an interest in the boat and the bill of sale was left in Marshfield with O. F. McKnight ready for the transfer when Mr. Golden paid over the money. He had his cash in the bank in Marshfield and on his last trip in here was ready to do it but Mr. McKnight was at court and he could not make the deal. He intended to do it on his return but they went direct from the Columbia to Rogue river. The delay saved him quite a loss. The Randolph was valued at about \$8,000 and was owned by people in and near Langlois, largely.

So far, very few fish have been caught at Rogue river, although the season opened last week. There are a large number there for the fishing season.—Coos Bay Times.

William Dungan and Charles Stauff, who returned from the southern part of the country last Saturday where Mr. Dungan is homesteading, say the vegetables the settlers planted in that section are doing fine and grow and thrive as well as garden truck in the most favored parts of the county. Mr. Dungan will remain here a short time and then return to his homestead.—Marshfield Record.
