

THEY WANT A WOMAN MAYOR

New York, June 17.—“The best possible candidate, man or woman, available,” was the qualification given Miss Jane Adams at the headquarters of the Women Suffrage party here today discussing the report that progressives and suffragists were proposing the famous founder of Hull House for mayor of Chicago at the election to be held two years hence. The discussion of Miss Adams as a possible candidate for mayor was more along the lines of her training for such a place and the ability she has shown, rather than upon the fact that her election would be a great victory for the suffrage cause.

“For years Miss Adams has been known not only as the first citizen of Chicago, but the first citizen of Illinois,” said Mrs. James L. Lai law, chairman for the woman's party in the borough of Manhattan.

“Leaving out the humanitarian side of her work, which is so well known—and lacking so much in some of our mayors—she has had tremendous training along general economics, social and governmental lines. She has shown the greatest executive ability. There is probably no one, either man or woman, who has had such wide training and is so well fitted for high positions. She is never thought of as a member of any party, but as representative of all classes. And I speak of her not as a woman and a representative of the suffrage party, but of her personal achievement, the ability she has shown and her fitness for high office. Now, holding such a high place in the eyes of the country, the only question is whether Miss Adams would be willing to accept the nomination for mayor. But certainly she would be well received.”

The Last of the Tillamooks.

What is said to be the sole surviving remnant of the Tillamook tribe of Indians arrived in Newport this week from north of Salmon River. Wm. Dick, chief, is accompanied by about a dozen men and women of the tribe, and the party made the long 60 mile trip here on a very important mission. They came to meet by appointment a Commissioner from Washington, D. C. and to sign some papers, after which the Government will turn over to them the sum of \$50,500 in settlement of a claim of 65 years' standing.

The money is due to the Tillamooks for the sale of their land to the Government. At the time of the sale the tribe numbered about 500 and their land embraced thousands of fertile acres which are now covered by Tillamook county's farm us dairy and hay ranches. The land which Uncle Sam acquired for a song is now worth millions of dollars.—Newport Signal.

ATLANTIC LET IN CANAL

Panama, June 15.—(Special)—The water from the Atlantic Ocean was let into the lower level of the Gatun locks yesterday.

This was for the purpose of testing the valves and the test was considered completely satisfactory.

Dredges will now complete the excavation from the ocean to the locks, which will amount to about 2,000,000 cubic yards.

LILJEQVIST MAY RESIGN

Coquille, June 19.—To Marshfield friends here yesterday County Attorney Liljeqvist (under the governor's appointment), said he thought seriously of quitting his office and might do so in a short time. Disgust at the invoke of the referendum, which has delayed the creating of the new office for this county, is what is actuating Mr. Liljeqvist in the move.

The Sentinel of the matter says: Should the supreme court uphold Judge Galloway's decision that the law providing for a special election on referendum measures be held next fall is unconstitutional, Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Liljeqvist will resign his office. The salary, which is only \$50 per month, is insufficient for the work performed.

Mr. Liljeqvist, under the new order of things, was appointed county attorney at a salary of \$1,800 per year. The bill creating the office, however, has been referred to the people, and instead of becoming imperative on June 3 is held up by the referendum petitions filed with the secretary of state. Should the election be held in November, as contemplated by the legislature, and the people sustain the action of the legislative body, then the appointment would go into immediate effect, but Mr. Liljeqvist does not care to continue his arduous duties until November 1914 at the present remuneration.—Ma shfield Record

PHARMACY LAW STRICT

The main features of the new pharmacy law, which concerns the people generally, are, briefly as follows:

All purchasers of poisonous drugs such as carbolic acid, strychnine, arsenic, corrosive sublimate, aconite, oxalic acid, muriatic acid, sulphuric acid, nitric acid, chloroform, potassium cyanide, etc., must give a satisfactory statement to the pharmacist as to the purpose for which the article is to be used, and must sign his or her name in the poison register giving such information and the date and the hour of sale. Any person signing a fictitious name or making any false representation to the seller when buying poisons will be subject to a fine or imprisonment or both. All narcotic or habit-forming drugs, such as morphine, cocaine and chlorhydrate can be sold on the prescription of a regularly licensed physician or dentist of the state only, which prescription cannot be refilled, and no copy or duplicate of same can be furnished by the pharmacist. They may be sold for veterinary use without prescription. Violators of this section of the law are subject to heavy fines or imprisonment or both.

The Oregon board of pharmacy is given power to cancel the certificate of any registered pharmacist who violates any section of the pharmacy law or when, in the judgment of the board, they have forfeited their title to registration.

The new law is a good one and will no doubt, to a large extent, check the sale of harmful drugs.—Marshfield Record.

“Red” Invades Chamber.

Rome, June 14.—Francesco Cocuzza, a Neapolitan Anarchist, was arrested in the Italian Chamber of Deputies today after having gained admittance in the disguise of a priest. The Anarchist twice before had succeeded in entering the chamber in 1906 and 1911, and on the latter occasion insulted Premier Giolitto before he was taken into custody.

Cocuzza said he wanted to renew his acquaintance with Premier Giolitto and that he had disguised himself in an attempt to avoid arrest.

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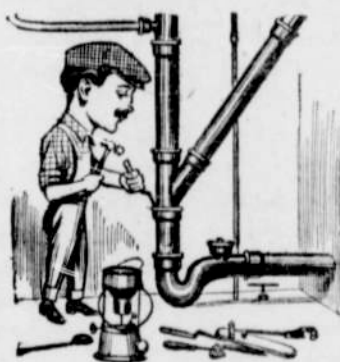
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
