Will Spend \$40,000.

The Port Orford Tribune says: The Southern Pacific has set aside over \$40,000 to be used in survey work between Portland and San Francisco. The line from Marshfield to Eureka is to be gone over again, and there is a strong likelihood that work will be commenced on the coast road within the next year. Railroad activities by several

different companies is forcing the Southern Pacific into action, and the building of this route along the coast, that has been surveyed and re-surveyed, is near at hand.

Notice is hereby given: That the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Twelfth Street West from the East line of Jackson Avenue, where Twelfth Street intersects said Jackson Avenue running thence East to the East line of Morris Addition to Bandon, Oregon, at the cost and expense of the owners of the lots, parts of lots and tracts of land included in the improvement district to be known as "Local Improvement District No. 5 of Twelfth Street, which district embraces all of the property on either side of said Twelfth Street between the East line of Jackson Avenue and the East line of Morris Addition, from the marginal line of said Twelfth Street back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon. Said improvement is to consist substantially of Grading the street, the construction of six feet wide wooden sidewalks, the construction of wooden curbs and cross-walks, all of said improvements to be built upon the established grade of Twelfth Street and in accordance with the plans and specifications thereof prepared by the City Engineer, filed in the office of the City Recorder and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein.

The total cost of said improvement is estimated to be \$2,181.27.

Any objections to said improvement (if any exists) must be filed in writing with the City Recorder on or before July 16, 1913 by the owners of Two-Thirds in the area of the property within the above described improvement district.

Notice of Assessments for Extension of Railroad Street into First Street in the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon.

Notice is hereby given: That at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, held upon the 14th day of May 1913, Ordinance No. 263 entitled, "An Ordinance adopting the report of the viewers appointed by the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Oregon, to view the proposed extension of Railroad Street into First Street in the said City of Bandon, and to make an assessment of the damages and benefits of said extension to the respective owners of property affected by such extension," was duly passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor on said date, which Ordinance directs me to enter the said assessments in the Docket of City Liens and from the date of the entry thereof in said Docket of City Liens the sum as entered against each lot or parcel of land, becomes and is a lien upon such lot or parcel of land, and unless the assessment is paid within the time prescribed by the Charter of the City of Bandon, Oregon, the lot or parcel of land so assessed will be sold to pay the assessment interest and cost. The whole cost of the extension of Railroad Street into First Street in the City of Bandon, Oregon, is \$10,908.23 and the boundaries of the district assessed for the cost of the same commences at the West line of Spruce Street (Now Edison Ave.) running thence East to the East line of Columbia Ave. (Now Fillmore Ave.) upon all lots, parts of lots and tracts of land abutting upon First Street and Railroad Street (Now First Street East and parts of lots and tracts of land not abutting upon First Street West) and upon other lots, on said street assessed with like benefits as set out in the report of the viewers and adopted by the Common Council which is now on file with the City Recorder.

Notice is hereby given: That the Common Council of the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Jackson Avenue in West Bandon Addition to Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, from the South line of Ocean Drive Street to the North line of Seventh (7th) Street West, and from the South line of Seventh (7th) Street West to the City limits line on the South, at the cost and expense of the owners of the lots, parts of lots and tracts of land included in the local improvement district to be known as Local Improvement No. 6 of Jackson Avenue, which district embraces all of the property on either side of said Jackson Avenue and

abutting thereon between the South line of Ocean Drive Street to the North line of Seventh Street West, and from the South line of Seventh Street West to the City limit line of the City of Bandon on the South, from the marginal line of said Jackson Avenue back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon. The total cost of said improvement is estimated to be \$7,974.10. Any objections to said improvement (if any exists) must be filed in writing with the City Recorder by the owners of Two-Thirds in the area of the property within the above described improvement district on or before July 16th, 1913.
