

IS THROWN 30 FEET BY TRAIN

Lyle Bigbee, brother of Morris Bigbee, who came here last week to join the Marshfield baseball team was injured last Saturday at Albany by an Oregon electric train and will spend some time in a hospital. The injured boy's home is in Eugene, and he is a student at the Oregon university. In the summer he works in the Oregon Electric offices at Albany and was out a mile from town doing some work for the company. He heard the train whistle, but did not realize its fast approach as he was traveling along the ties in front of it and when he realized its nearness, he jumped, but was struck a glancing blow and thrown 30 feet against a switch. His head was cut and he received injuries in his side. He was put on the train and hurried to a hospital at Eugene, and at last accounts was certain to recover, since his hurts were not dangerous. The injured boy is pitching ball for the Albany Athletics this summer.—Marshfield Record.

To Prevent Tuberculosis.

The following legislation by the last session of the legislature, governing tuberculosis will be of interest to our readers:

Sec. 1. That every physician or other person practicing the art of healing shall file with the State Board of Health a written report giving the names and addresses of all persons afflicted with pulmonary tuberculosis (consumption), concerning which he or she may be consulted as soon as the nature of the disease is determined.

Sec. 2. That any representative of a religious denomination or any householder, or any nurse, parent, guardian or other person attending or in any way having knowledge of the existence of a case of pulmonary tuberculosis (including the person afflicted therewith), must immediately report the same to the State Board of Health.

Sec. 3. The names and addresses of all persons afflicted with pulmonary tuberculosis shall be recorded in the State Board of Health, and it shall be unlawful for any person suffering from this disease to change his or her residence or to be removed therefrom until the State Board of Health has been notified, so that the vacated residence may be fumigated.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of any physician or any representative of a religious denomination, or any householder, nurse, parent, guardian, or other person having knowledge of a change of residence of any person afflicted with pulmonary tuberculosis to report the same to the State Board of Health.

Sec. 5. No furniture, bedding, or other material used by a person afflicted with pulmonary tuberculosis shall be sold, delivered or used by any person until such furniture, bedding or material has been fumigated. Fumigation or disinfection shall be in accordance with rules prescribed by the State Board of Health.

Sec. 6. Any person owning a house rented to or occupied by a person afflicted by tuberculosis shall fumigate or disinfect the same forthwith upon the leaving of the house by such person.

Sec. 7. No books shall be loaned from a public library to any person afflicted with pulmonary tuberculosis or to any person living in a residence where a case of pulmonary tuberculosis exists.

Sec. 8. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall upon conviction therefor be fined not more than \$300 for each offense or be imprisoned in the county jail not more than one year, or be punished by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

BRICK BUILDING FOR BANDON

Marshfield Woman Heiress.

Mrs. H. H. Wilson, who conducts a rooming house in the O'Connell building on Market avenue, and whose husband is proprietor of the Coos Bay Monumental Works, will probably inherit \$150,000 to \$200,000 from the estate of her father L. S. Kelsey, of North Powder, Oregon who was killed recently in an auto accident near Baker City.

Four others were seriously injured in the accident, in which Mr. Kelsey lost his life. The auto was Mr. Kelsey's and he was driving the machine himself when the car skidded and turned turtle with disastrous results. Accompanying Mr. Kelsey, was R. S. Seater, proprietor of the North Powder hotel, his wife and daughter and Mrs. B. Clarke.

Kelsey was driving the car and Slater was on the front seat with him. The three women were in the rear seat. In turning a sharp corner the car skidded, ran over a ditch and into a tence, where it turned turtle. Kelsey and Mr. Clark's daughter were pinned underneath. All were rendered unconscious.

They were discovered shortly after and hurried to St. Elizabeth's hospital, Baker City, for medical treatment, but Mr. Kelsey died on the way, his neck being broken.

Mr. Kelsey was a prominent banker, rancher and stockman and leaves an estate valued at nearly a million dollars, in which Mrs. Wilson will share.—Coos Bay Times.

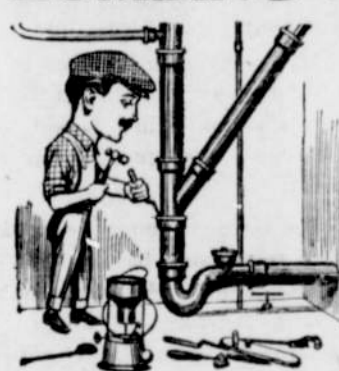
