Chicago baseball fans are particularly interested in the signing of ORVIE Overall, the giant pitcher of the Cubs, who recently joined the team after being out of big league baseball for three years. Manager Evers says that if "Big Jeff" is as good as he was in 1909 the Cubs will have something to say about where the pennant will fly. Overall does not expect to do any pitching until the middle of May, or possibly June 1 as he does not want to
