

# R. R. WORK PROGRESSING

Cut Made Through Park and Much Work Done North of City.

The work along the S. P. right of way through the park in this city has been moving smoothly considering the great amount of rain. A cut twenty feet in length has been made to the bridge approach at Pony Slough, and the tracks are being moved to start upon the second cut which will be made in less time. The dirt from the whole right of way consisting of 150 feet in width and 40 feet depth will probably be needed to fill in from the trestle to the box factory, and at the approach to the bridge at Pony Slough. This it is said is sufficient for the laying of five tracks and could be utilized for yard purposes. The old plank on Virginia street is being removed and elevated to the grade established, the company using the old planks for bulk heading. A new railroad camp has been established near the old stove mill and considerable work is in progress between North Bend and Marshfield. About twenty men are at work grading the hill at this point, where the work is difficult and among the difficulties is the removal of about 600 feet of the Coos Bay Water Co's maines, which have to be removed and relayed about 100 feet farther south. Work on the foundation for the piers which was announced some time ago to commence July 1st has been delayed, but it is said the reason for this is that the entire bridge can be built in six months and was delayed on account of other parts of the road, such as the construction of the Wind Creek tunnel which will take 18 months to complete making it unnecessary for the expense at this time. The right of way of the Terminal lumber has not been settled, the cause of which it is said is that the C. S. Smith Company through its yards and other franchises held by them ask \$200,000 which is held by the S. P. company as exorbitant. The announcement of Chief Engineer Hood's coming here this week is understood to have some meaning in this connection. It is said that the Southern Pacific company are unable to agree on a price for the right of way through the Coos Bay Manufacturing Co's land and that a condemnation suit will be instituted at once—Coos Bay Harbor.
