Barton Denied New Trial

J. S. Barton, who was convicted by a jury at the late term of the Coos county circuit court, of attempted rape upon the person of a young woman of Coquille, was yesterday denied his motion for a new trial. Chas. McKnight, Mr. Barton's attorney, would not talk of the case this morning, any more than to say the application had been denied and Mr. Barton will be sentenced next Monday. The arguments heard yesterday by Judge Coke occupied several hours, but at the conclusion, the judge said the new law which prevents judges from interfering with or setting aside jury verdicts left no action for him except denial of the motions. He then set next Monday for the day of sentencing Mr. Barton. Deputy Prosecuting Attorney L. A. Liljeqvist, who was representing the state in the proceeding said in court that the evidence heard at the trial did not warrant the verdict rendered, but the court was without power to change the status of the case. Mr. McKnight said the case will be appealed.—Marshfield Record.
