Call out the Militia.

The Socialist party of Oregon, acting through a mass meeting at Portland, denounces the "business mob" at Bandon which drove the agitator Leach from the town. In the extraordinary set of resolutions adopted by the Socialists one may discover the enunciation of several new and strange doctrines—new and strange to the ordinary Socialist mind. The right of free speech is vehemently upheld, which is neither new nor strange, when the Socialists want to talk; but the indefeasible right of private ownership of property is likewise asserted, and the eminent value of the militia is recognized. Else why the demand that the community of Bandon and Coos county be required to pay to Dr. Leach all damages that he may have sustained, either in his property or his person, even if necessary using the militia to that end?

Thus we see that the right of the community to confiscate the property of any individual citizen is denied and the odious militia is all right if it may be employed to protect a Socialist. Your Socialist is hot for confiscation or division of all the world's wealth so long as he has none; but when he has something, he even sees virtue in the militia.

The public might have been better impressed with the sincerity and validity of the Socialist protest if there had been similar action in defense of free speech, for example, following the outrageous outbreak at the Baden-Powell meeting in Portland a year or more ago. But what has your Socialist ever done for the flag, or law and order, or free speech, except to assert his own individual rights and beliefs against the rights, duties, opinions and needs of all others, including the state itself?—Portland Oregonian.
