Forest Fire Season.

A Willamette Valley exchange, in mentioning the open deer season between August 1 and October 31, says that it is between those dates that the forest fires occur.—This is undoubtedly true. In the first place August and September comprise the dry season in Oregon, and with numbers of hunters in the mountains some of whom are very careless about fire, it is no wonder that large tracts of valuable timber are annually destroyed. Then, again, settlers owning small pieces of bottom land, or a limited acreage of bench land, frequently start fires to clear off brush and small timber and thus secure a range for stock. These fires spread, and after gaining headway are swept by a strong wind into the big timber, where, if the forest should be cedar, the damage is enormous. Fires originating from this

cause were responsible for the destruction of thousands of acres of the finest cedar timber in the world, lying between the mouth of the Coquille river and Port Orford, in early days. The timber at that time was of no value to the few settlers who were endeavoring to carve homes in the wilderness. What they wanted was range for stock, and the "Bald Hills" country in southern Coos and in Curry county show that their efforts were not in vain. Of course the cedar timber on those hills would be worth many times the value of the range, but at that time there was no demand for timber, and nobody at that time thought that there ever would be.—Coos Bay News.

Cowgirl to Ride Texas Steer at the Round-up.
