### Coos County Gets \$11,432

-----

Compared with the total of last year's apportionment of the interest of the irreducible school fund among the counties of the state, the total of the apportionment made for this year exceeds it by \$8230.14, the total for this year being \$360,711.30 and that for last year \$352,481.16. in the school population during the year, the total population for the reduced 3 cents, the per capita apportionment last year being \$1.86 and that for this year \$1.83.

The apportionment among the counties as made on August 1 gives Coos county \$11,432.01, the school population being 6,247.
