Gage is Indifferent.
Marshfield Record: Sheriff W. W. Gage, who is here today from Coquille, does not seem greatly worried over Governor West's latest statement about sending Attorney-General Crawford into his county. John McKenzie, one of Elk River's prosperous stockmen and farmers, was in town a few days ago and informed us that he recently contracted his two-year-old steers to Bob Wagner, the Bandon stock buyer for \$60 per head. Dry cows are selling at Port Orford for 4 and 5 cents live weight, and steers for 6 cents. This is the highest price ever paid for beef cattle in this vicinity.

Notice of Street Work.
Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the city of Bandon, Coos county, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Ocean Drive from its intersection with 4th street west to the west line of Jackson Avenue, in the city of Bandon, Coos county, Oregon, at the cost and expense of the owners of the lots, parts of lots and tracts of land included in the improvement district to be known as Local Improvement District No. 9, of Ocean Drive, which district embraces all of the property (land) on either side of said Ocean Drive and abutting thereon between the intersection of Ocean Drive with Fourth Street West, to the west line of Jackson Avenue from the marginal line of said Ocean Drive back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon.

Said improvement is to consist substantially of grading the roadway, laying and spreading of road metal (to-wit crushed rock) building of sidewalks, reconstructing sidewalk to grade where now built, and building cross-walks, to be built upon the established grade of said Ocean Drive and in accordance with the plans and specifications for said improvement as prepared by the city engineer filed in the office of the city recorder and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein. Any objections to said improvement (if any exist) must be filed in writing with the city recorder by the owners of two-thirds in the area of the property within the above described assessment district on or before August 28, 1913.
