Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the city of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Third Street East from the east line of Chicago Avenue to the west line of Baltimore Avenue in Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, at the cost and expense of the owners of the lots parts of lots and tracts of land included in the improvement district to be known as Local Improvement District No. 10 of Third Street East which district embraces all of the property on either side of said street and abutting thereon, between East line of Chicago Avenue to the west

line of Baltimore Avenue from the marginal line of said Third Street East, back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon. Said improvement is to consist substantially of grading the street, building wooden sidewalks and crosswalks and drain box, all of said improvements to be built upon established grade of Third Street East, and in accordance with the plans and specifications thereof prepared by the city engineer, filed in the office of the city recorder and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein. Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the city of Bandon, Coos county, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Baltimore Avenue from the south line of Third Street East to the north line of Thirteenth Street East, in Bandon, Coos county, Oregon, at the cost and expense of the owners of the lots parts of lots and tracts of land included in the improvement district to be known as Local Improvement District No. 11 of Baltimore Avenue which district embraces all of the property on either side of said street and abutting thereon, between the south line of Third Street East and the north line of Thirteenth Street East, from the marginal line of said Baltimore Avenue back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon.
