Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Bandon, Coos county, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Jackson Avenue from the South line of Ocean Drive to the north line of Seventh Street West, and from the south line of Seventh Street West to the city limits, to-wit 13th, Street East, at the cost and expense of the owners of the lots parts of lots and tracts of land included in the following described improvement district to be known as Local Improvement District No. 13 of Jackson Avenue which district embraces all of the property on either side of said street and abutting thereon between the south line of Ocean Drive to the north line of Seventh Street West and from the south line of Seventh Street West to the city limits from the marginal line of said street back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon. Said improvement is to consist substantially of grading the street, building wooden curbs constructing wooden sidewalks and crosswalks, all of said improvements to be built upon the established grade of Jackson Avenue, and in accordance with plans and specifications thereof prepared by the city engineer filed in the office of the city recorder and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein. The total cost of said improvement is estimated to be \$3,865.10.

Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve Seventh Street West from the east line of Jackson Avenue to the west line of Jackson Avenue, at the cost and expense of the owners of the lots parts of lots and tracts of land included in the following described improvement district to be known as Local Improvement District No. 14 of Seventh Street west which district embraces all of the property on either side of said street and abutting thereon between the east line of Jackson Avenue and the west line of Jackson Avenue, from the marginal line of said street back to the center of the block or blocks abutting thereon.
