Resolution.

It is resolved by the City of Bandon, that the Common Council of the City of Bandon deems it expedient and necessary to construct a sewer along the center line of Franklin Ave. from the center line of Thirteenth Street, West, to the center line of Fourth Street, West.

Also along the center line of Ocean Drive from the center line of Jackson Ave. to Fourth Street, West; thence along the center line of Fourth Street, West, to the center line of Edison Ave. from the center line of Fourth Street, West, to the center line of First Street West; thence westerly along the center line of First Street, West, from the center line of Edison Ave. to deep water.

Also along the center line of 9th Street, West, from the center line of Harrison Ave. to the center line of Franklin Ave.

Also along the center line of 11th Street, West, from the center line of Harrison Ave. to the center line of Franklin Ave.

That the City Engineer of the City of Bandon prepared and filed in the office of the City Recorder, maps, profiles, plans, specifications and estimates of the work to be done in the construction of a sewer along the lines above mentioned and the probable cost thereof, together with a statement outlining the district which, in his opinion, will be especially benefited by such sewer and should be assessed with the cost and expense of the construction thereof.

That the Common Council finds said plans, profiles, maps and specifications and the assessment district satisfactory and hereby approves the same.

That the Common Council does hereby declare its intention to construct said sewer according to the maps, profiles, plans and specifications therefor and that the estimated cost is \$6438.95.

It is further hereby resolved that a sewer be constructed on the streets and avenues and between the points hereinbefore designated according to the maps, plan, profiles and specifications therefor on file in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Bandon.

That the assessment district to be benefited by the construction of said sewer and to be assessed therefore shall comprise all of—

Lot 1, Block 15, Azalea Park Addition to Bandon.

Lots 1 to 12 inclusive, Block 7, Azalea Park Addition to Bandon.

Lots 11 to 22 inclusive, Block 8, Azalea Park Addition to Bandon.

Lots 1 and 12, Block 12, Azalea Park Addition to Bandon.

Lot 1, Block 11, Azalea Park Addition to Bandon.

Lots 1 to 12 inclusive, Block 9, Azalea Park Addition to Bandon.

Lots 1 to 11 inclusive, Block 10, Azalea Park Addition to Bandon.

Lot 1, Block 3, South Bandon.

Lots 1 and 18, Block 2, South Bandon.

Also a piece of ground described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the west line of Harrison Ave. with the South line of Ocean Drive; thence south 112.85 feet; west 80 ft; north 60 feet and easterly 95.88 feet to place of beginning.

Also a piece of ground described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the east line of Harrison Ave. and the South line of Ocean Drive; thence South along Harrison Ave 100 ft; thence east to west line of Cartwrights Add to Bandon; thence

North to South line of Block 20. Town of Bandon; thence Northerly along the south line of said Block 20 to the north line of Ocean Drive; thence southerly along the south line of Ocean Drive to place of beginning.

A piece of ground described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the north line of North Street, West, and the east line of Franklin Ave; running thence north along the east line of Franklin Ave 257.3 ft; thence east 132.6 ft; thence North 257.3 ft; thence West 132.6 ft to place of beginning.

Also a piece of ground described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the east line of Edison Ave and the North line of Second Street, West; thence Northerly along the east line of Edison Ave, 200 feet; thence easterly along the south line of First Street, West, 50 feet; thence southerly and parallel to Edison Ave 200 feet to north line of Second Street, West thence westerly along the North line of Second Street, West 50 feet to place of beginning.

Also a piece of ground described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the south line of Second Street, West, and the West line of Edison Ave; running thence southerly along the West line of Edison Ave 460 feet to the North line of Fourth Street, West; thence westerly along the north line of Fourth Street, West, 540 feet, to the east line of Garfield Ave; thence northerly along the east line of Garfield Ave 100 feet; thence easterly and parallel with Fourth Street, West, 440 feet; thence northerly and parallel with Edison Ave 360 ft to the South line of Second Street, West; thence easterly along the south line of Second Street, West, 100 feet to place of beginning.

That the City Recorder be and he is hereby directed to publish this resolution at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in the city official paper.
