Heavy Penalty For Illegal Voting.

The last legislature changed many laws and made many new ones. One of these is in regard to illegal registration voting. The penalty is severe. Section 3465 of the general laws of Oregon provide that "any person who shall willfully or feigningly register more than once, or register under any but his true name, or attempt to vote by impersonating another who is registered, or knowingly register in any precinct where he is not a resident at the time of registering, upon conviction shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than one year nor more than three years, or by fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$2,000, or both such fine and imprisonment" may be imposed.

Big Steamer Goes Ashore.

Sattle, Oct. 4.—The big passenger steamer Spokane, from Alaska ports for Seattle, went ashore on the east shore of Vancouver Island, fifteen miles north of Cape Lazo at nine o'clock last night in the snow or fog. The wireless operator sent out frantic distress calls which were picked up by ships and stations all along the Pacific coast causing great alarm. The first vessel to respond to the Spokane's calls was the freighter Latouche, which was soon standing by. Seventy-nine passengers were transferred to the Latouche in the small boats. Forty others refused to leave the comfortable quarters on the Spokane. The Spokane got off and is proceeding to Seattle with all passengers.

Resolution.

It is resolved by the city of Bandon, that the Common Council of the City of Bandon deem it expedient and necessary to construct a sewer along the center line of First Street, North, from the center line of June Ave. to the center line of Harlem Ave. thence South along the center line of Harlem Ave. to the center line of Caroline Street, also along the center line of First Street, East, from the center line of June Ave. to the center line of Harlem Ave. thence north along the center line of Harlem Ave. to the center line of Caroline Street.

That the City Engineer of the City of Bandon prepared and filed in the office of the City Recorder, maps, profiles, plans, specifications and estimates of the work to be done in the construction of a sewer along the lines above mentioned and the probable cost thereof, together with a statement outlining the district which, in his opinion, will be especially benefited by such sewer and should be assessed with the cost and expense of the construction thereof.

That the Common Council finds said plans, profiles, maps and specifications and the assessment district satisfactory and hereby approves the same.

That the Common Council does hereby declare its intention to construct said sewer according to the maps, profiles, plans and specifications therefor and that the estimated cost is \$2073.20.

It is further hereby resolved that a sewer be constructed through the streets and avenues and between the points hereinbefore designated according to the maps, plans, profiles and specifications therefor on file in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Bandon.

That the assessment district to be benefited by the construction of said sewer and to be assessed therefore shall comprise all of—
Lots 16 to 30 inclusive in Blk. 4, Bandon Heights Add. to Bandon.
Lots 1 to 15 inclusive in Block 5, Bandon Heights Add. to Bandon.
Lots 15 to 30 inclusive in Block 12, Bandon Heights Add. to Bandon.
Lots 1 to 15 inclusive in Block 13, Bandon Heights Add. to Bandon.

Also a piece of land described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the extension of the south line of Blk. 4 in Bandon Heights Addition to Bandon, Coos Co., Ore., and the west line of Harlem Ave.; running thence south along the west line of Harlem Ave. to a point where the said line intersects with the north line of Block 13, Bandon Heights Add., extended thence west 100 feet; thence north and parallel to the west line of Harlem Ave. to a point 50 feet due west of point of beginning; thence east 50 feet to place of beginning, excepting herefrom Caroline Street 60 ft X 50 ft.

That the City Recorder be and he is hereby directed to publish this resolution at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in the city official paper.
