Principal Use of Each Breed of Dairy Cattle.

Oregon Agricultural College Corvallis, Ore., Oct. 23.—“There are only four breeds of special dairy cows that are really worth considering by dairymen of this state,” says Dr. James Withcombe, director of the College Experiment Station. “These four are the Jersey, Guernsey, Holstein and the Ayrshire. Each of these breeds possesses a superior adaptability to certain conditions.

“On the small farm or on high priced land where the production of butter fat is the principal object the Jersey is the best. If the production of high class milk for city trade is desired, no breed surpasses the Gurnsey. Gurnsey milk is highly colored and excellently flavored. In sections where there is an abundance of cheap feed, and milk to be produced for condensing or cheese making, no other breed equals that veritable milk machine, the Holstein. Under more rugged pasture conditions where a good quantity of milk is desired without heavy grain feeding, the Ayrshire is the cow that best fills the bill.”

Farmers Week Boiled Down Institute Work.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Ore., Oct. 23.—Farmers' Week as conducted this year will be a concentrated and developed farmers' institute, with all the machinery of the Oregon Agricultural College available for the farmers' use. The work will be intensive, practical and objective. The students of Farmers' Week will have the use of all the advantages supplied by the State—instructors, buildings, laboratories, experiment plots, orchards, fields, gardens,

livestock and machinery. One of the most important phases of the work will be rural organization, cooperation and credits. Farmers who see the necessity of something more than large crops to make their work as successful as it should be will be informed of successful methods of organization and direct marketing, as practiced in most European and in a few American countries. European farmers are making better progress than American farmers. The chief causes of this are the better co-operative, credit and marketing methods of the European farmers. These systems will be explained by Dr. Hectoe Macpherson who went to Europe to investigate them, and recommendations for rural organization in Oregon will be made by himself and other experts.

An opportunity will also be given farmers to examine the approved machinery and tools of the College collection, and as far as possible to test their merits.

The dairy demonstrations will include selection, feed and management of the dairy herd; sanitary methods of milking and handling milk; and separating, ripening and manufacturing cream.
