able timber trees of the country is the tulip tree, known to lumbermen as yellow poplar. It is related to the magnolias, but is the only tree of its kind in the world.

The largest tree in the United States is said to be the "Mother of the Forest" a giant redwood in the Calaveras big tree grove in California. It is supposed to contain 140,619 board feet of lumber. There are, however, many claimants for the honor of being the "largest tree" and the "oldest tree," and these claims, according to foresters, can not always be verified.

**Proceedings of the Boundary Board.**

The District Boundary Board met on Nov. 5th with all members consisting of Judge J. F. Hall, Commissioner Armstrong and Dement and County Supt. Baker, present.

A petition from residents and the legal voters of school District No. 36 otherwise known as the Rogers District, asking for consolidation with Districts Nos. 39 and 86 was granted.

Similar petitions from Districts Nos. 39 and 86 for the consolidation of the Rogers District (No. 36) Coos River district (No. 39) and the new district at the forks of Coos river, No. 86, were granted.

Petitions from districts Nos. 14 (Riverton) and 55 (Beaver Slough) for the consolidation of these two districts were granted.

A petition from certain residents of district No. 58 (Sunnyside) and district No. 14 (Riverton) asking for consolidation of these two districts was considered. A remonstrance against the proposed consolidation signed by property owners and tax payers of district No. 58 was also taken under advisement. As it was difficult to decide what was the will of the actual residents of this district, the Boundary Board referred the matter of the consolidation of the two districts back to the people to be decided by a vote of the legally qualified residents of each district at the next annual meeting, June 15, 1914.

The following described property was taken from school district No. 45 Coos county, Oregon, and transferred to school district No. 1:

Beginning at the S W cor of Sec 7 Twp 25 S R 11 W thence North to the N W corner of said Sec thence East to the N E cor of said Sec. thence South to the North Fork of Coos river, thence up said North Fork of Coos river to the intersection of said river and the line running north and south through the center of Sec. 8, 25-11 thence south to the south line of said Sec 8, thence West to the place of beginning.

The appointment of Z. T. Johnson to act as Special Truant Officer for School District No. 41 was confirmed.—Raymond E. Baker, Secretary.
