**BUMPER YEAR FOR FARMER**

Ten Billion Dollars Worth of Products Raised in United States.

Washington, Jan. 5.—Ten billion dollars worth of products, five billion dollars of cash income—a bumper year in spite of drouths and other setbacks—is the 1913 record of six million American farms. The most successful year of husbandry in the United States brought forth \$6,100,000,000 worth of crops, of which \$2,896,000,000 were represented by cereals alone and \$3,650,000,000 worth of animals sold and slaughtered. The value of the 1913 crop is twice as great as that of 1899, more than a billion dollars over 1909 and substantially greater than 1912.

**Asked To Remain Out**  
Washington, Jan. 5—Warning to Americans who have left Mexico against returning to that country has been issued by the State Department.

"The information in the possession of the department," says an official statement, "indicates that economic conditions have not changed in such a way as to justify an attempt to return to Mexico and resume industrial operations there, and that any purpose to take such a step is due to misunderstanding or misrepresentations as to actual conditions and prospect at the present moment."
