The road bonding question is, we think, one of the most important questions that will come before the voters on May 15th. It will be a big step forward in the development of Coos county if these bonds carry. Good roads are an asset to the farmer, manufacturer and business man alike. By facilitating traffic they will bring the towns of the county into closer relations, and the farmers closer to the towns. They will open up districts to all-year-around trade which are now practically isolated in winter time. They will increase the value of farm property and at the same time make it appear more inviting to prospective settlers. If you want to hasten the development of Coos county vote for the road bonds.
